

The numbers don't lie: more and more males are getting into the nursing profession. According to a March 2020 article, the four central hospitals in Ohio all saw a marked increase in their number of male nurses. Nationwide, Children's hospitals' ratio of male nurses jumped 66%, while Ohio State University's Wexner Medical Center doubled their rates of male nurses over the past decade. There is also a demand for more male nurses in the healthcare field, as providers and patients alike become aware of the many benefits male-identifying nurses can provide. For instance, the presence of more male-identifying nurses can help ensure that male patients feel represented. And for certain sensitive procedures, patients might prefer a nurse of a certain sex, particularly for procedures such as inserting a catheter, using the bathroom or bedpan, or giving an enema

As described in Minority Nurse Journal, men are entering into the nursing workforce for a variety of reasons, such as a shift in availability in other traditionally male professions, like the automotive industry. - Career Stability: The demand for Registered Nurses is predicted to exceed 3.19 million by 2024.
 Stable Pay: Minority Nurse notes that unemployed men who move into female-dominated careers -- such as nursing -- tend to see a 3.8% rise in their pay.
- Career Flexibility: Nursing is a unique field that allows for part-time, full-time, variable, per diem, or combination shifts. And because many male nurses enter the field mid-career, flexibility may be even more prized.
- Travel Opportunities: Male nurses who are interested in travel can enter the field of travel nursing to try their hand at learning new skills and traveling to new places.
- Scholarships for Male Nurses: There are a variety of scholarships available to prospective male nurses, such as those offered through the American Association of Male Nurses.

Popular Specialties for Male Nurses

There are male nurses in every nurse specialty -- from obstetrics to geriatrics to sexual assault examiners. But there seem to be certain specialties that attract a larger number of men. Some of the more popular specialties for male nurses include:

- Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA): One of the highest-paying professions in the nursing field, Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists provide anesthesia care for patients undergoing surgical procedures. Admission Criteria



Eligibility criteria for appearing in GNM (Male)

1.Domicile criteria: The applicant must be a citizen of India and must be domicile of West Bengal.

2.Qualification: The applicant must have passed already in class 12th (10+2) system only. ('Passed' means passed in both theory and practical/ project as applicable.)

3.Age: The minimum age for admission in B. Sc Nursing shall be 17 years on 31st December of the year admission is sought. The maximum age for admission is 35 years.

4.Language: Must be able to read, write and express in Bengali and/or Nepali.

• Academic Criteria :

- Must pass '10+2' examination from any recognized
- Board with at least 40% mark in aggregate.
- Must pass in English in (10+2) examination.
- Candidates passing (10+2) in Vocational Stream must be from the Health Care Science discipline.
- Medical Fitness Certificate: All candidates must be medically fit for the course and produce a Medical Fitness Certificate in the format given in APPENDIX- 3 at the time of admission.
- Recognized Board: Refer to the list of recognized Board/Council given in Board's website # www.wbjeeb.nic.in

Eligibility criteria for appearing in B.Sc Nursing

- **1.Domicile criteria:** The applicant must be a citizen of India and must be domicile of West Bengal.
- **2.Qualification:** The applicant must have passed already in class 12th (10+2) system only.
- **3.Age:** The minimum age for admission in B. Sc Nursing shall be 17 years on 31st December of the year admission is sought. The maximum age for admission is 35 years.

Academic Criteria :

- Candidate must pass the subjects with individual pass marks (In both theory and practical separately, wherever applicable)
- For General and EWS: 10+2 class passed with Science (PCB) with aggregate of 45% for General/EWS and 40% For SC/ST/OBC/Pwd marks from recognized board. Must pass in English.
- Candidate must pass (10+2) examination from any recognized board/council. (Refer to the list of recognized Board/Council given in Board's website #www.wbjeeb.nic.in)
- Student shall be medically fit as per WBJEE proforma.
- Student shall be admitted once in a year.



Withdrawal from the course -

As a matter of policy, students are not relieved during the course of study, if any student after admission to the programme decides to withdraw voluntarily from the college at any time before completing the programme she or he shall have to communicate her or his decision to the university in writing along with their parent's consent letter. Fees and documents are non-refundable in any circumstance.

Anti Sexual Harassment Committee -

Anti Sexual Harassment Committee, comprising of members from the teaching and non-teaching staff as well as students looks into matters related to sexual harassment of students and staffs in the college. The boards indicating the names, their phone numbers of the committee members are displayed in the college.

Ragging -

Ragging in any form is a punishable offence and committing this act of indiscipline shall result in instant cancellation of the concerned student's admission to the course or into his/her rustication. It must be noted that the institute considers ragging a cognizable offence and will not hesitate to take strong action against the offenders Here are the extracts from the UGC's Committee Report. Guidelines given by the University Grants Commission to Curb the Menace of Ragging in Universities/ Educational Institutions.

The word "Ragging" means the act of teasing, taunting, playing a practical joke upon someone or holding comicparades and other activities during certain period of a college term to raise money for charity.

Punishments -

- Cancellation of admission
- Suspension from attending classes.
- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Expulsion from the hostel.
- Rustication from the institution for periods varying from 1 to -1 semesters
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
- Fine up to Rs. 25,000/-
- Rigorous imprisonment up to three years.



While the first 10 types of punishment can be awarded by the appropriate authority of the institution itself, the last punishment can be awarded only by a court of law.
